## **CAMEL DOODH MELA**

The Camel Milk Competition (Doodh Mela) at Government Livestock Farm (GLF), Jugaitpeer, Distt. Bahawalpur was organized on **April 10-12**, **2015** by the L&DD Dept with the help of Camel Association of Pakistan (CAP). A lot of preparations were made to organize this event among the Rohi herders. Dr Munir Ahmad Gill, Superintendent of the GLF and Dr Riaz Hussain (Manager, GLF) and their staff were the host of this event who made an extensive arrangements and various committees were constituted to have field work done before the event. The Convener of this event, the honorable DG (Ext) Dr Muhammad Nawaz Saeed took his time out of his busy schedule to look after the arrangements, organization and patronize this milk competition of camels at GLF Jugaitpeer, Bahawalpur. He was accompanied by Dr Rashid Ahmad (DG Res), Dr Khalid M Khan (DLF) and Dr Mansoor Ahmad (Director SR) at this occasion.

Prof Dr Muhammad Younas, President, Camel Association of Pakistan (CAP, UAF), Dr Asim Faraz (CAP, UAF) represented the University. All Committees did a wonderful job in setting this stage on the evening of April 10, 2015. Although weather became harsh, windy, stormy but camel and their herders didn't give up and reached to the site after a great deal of hassle. This Doodh Mela also attracted many farmers and breeders of the area.

First two milking (April 11, 2015, M&E) were made to empty the udders of the competing she camels, while the milkings of April 12, 2015, M&E were counted for competition. Based on the experience of the previous years, this time two separate categories were created for Marecha and Brela she camels.

This was a great event and many Rohi herders participated in this Moot. Cholistan is a place where 60 % of the total camels of Pakistan (I M) are habituated in and around the desert. About 30 breeders of the area participated with their  $\sim 60$  wet animals.

Can you imagine that she Brela camel produced 11.93 kg and Marecha she camel produced 9.59 kg of milk in 24 hrs under desert conditions. The first three winners of Brela breed were Shahid Khan (I), Muhammad Amin (II) and Ata Muhammad (III) who were given cash prizes of **Rs 100,000**/-, **50,000**/-, and **25,000**/-, respectively. While first three prizes of Marecha were won by Wali Muhammad (I), Manzoor Ahmad (II) and Muhammad Ramzan (III), who were also given the cash prizes of **Rs 100,000**/-, **50,000**/-, and **25,000**/-, respectively (see Table). Trophies and certificate were given away to the winners and organizers.

The prizes were given away by the President, Camel Association of Pakistan (CAP) and Dr Nawaz Saeed, DG (Ext) Livestock and Dairy Development, 16 Cooper Rd, Lahore. All camel herders were given free feed to their animals and local hospitality to the Rohilla breeders and herders by the GLF staff under the guidance of Dr Munir A Gill and Dr Riaz Hussain.
